Professional Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine (Residency) in Equine Sports Medicine and Surgery

Applications are invited from veterinary graduates for a Professional Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine (Residency) in Equine Sports Medicine and Surgery. The scholarship will commence in July 2020 and will run for a four-year and two-month fixed-term, renewable annually subject to completion of required DVetMed components.

The position will be based at the Easter Bush Campus, Roslin, where the resident will participate in the activities of the Equine Referral Hospital, specifically, the diagnosis and treatment of sports medicine cases, as well as out of hours' emergencies. Relevant postgraduate clinical experience including at least one years' rotating internship or at least two years clinical practice in equine/mixed practice is required, and candidates must be eligible to become a member of the RCVS. Applicants should also hold appropriate English language qualifications, where necessary.

The successful applicant will register for the European College of Veterinary Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation (ECVSMR) Diploma and a doctorate of veterinary medicine degree with clinical and teaching duties.

The world renowned Dick Vet Equine Hospital has a diverse group of staff with recognized specialists in surgery, medicine, dentistry, neurology, anaesthesia, imaging and pathology supported by a team of nurses and grooms. Recent investment in the clinic has seen the opening of a state of the art equine diagnostic and surgical unit, and a high field MRI unit is due to open in 2020.

The residency will be supervised by Drs. Sarah Taylor and John Keen.

The residency attracts an annual tax-free stipend of £19,664.08 with a supplement payable for on-call duties and an additional allowance of £600 per annum available for approved travel, examination fees and CPD. Postgraduate fees will be paid by the University of Edinburgh at UK level.
